New community leaflet

The Environment Agency have a new leaflet for residents in flood risk areas explaining what you can do to prepare, what to do when you get a flood warning and actions to stop flood water coming into your home.

The Environment Agency has upgraded its system to issue Flood Alerts and Warnings. It's now more user friendly and has a number of new features. You will continue to receive Alerts/Warnings as before but you may wish to login and to see the new features or check your contact details are up to date. Remember, you can receive alerts and warnings for a specific area(s) or properties in your community even if you live in a different area. This may be really useful in your role as a Flood Warden.

As part of the new system some Quick Dial numbers have changed. This is the number you can enter after calling Floodline to quickly access up to date flood information for your area. Please use the Quick Dial number quoted at the end of your Flood Alert or Flood Warning as and when they are issued. Alternatively a list of the new codes can be found at the back of the new Flood Warden Handbook or email the Environment Agency (address below) for a copy.

Met Office Changes

Have you downloaded the new Met Office App? The new App allows you to monitor where the rain is falling and where it is forecast to fall. You can also keep an eye on any weather warnings that may affect your area with notifications sent to you so that you never miss them. As well as the

rainfall radar and warnings you can get a 7-day forecast and even a video forecast for the next 24 hours. Why not take a look?



You may also have noted some changes to the warnings pages on the Met Office website. Over the next few months the way warnings are displayed and communicated will change. These changes have already started but there is more to come. Have a look at www.metoffice.gov.uk/public/weather/warnings.
